

Dr. Tatiana Saburova, a visiting Professor at Indiana University, Professor at the Department of History, Omsk State Pedagogical University and a Research Fellow at Higher School of Economics (Moscow). Her first book was on the social and cultural representations of Russian intellectuals (*Mythologies of the Russian Intellectual World: Socio-Cultural Representations of the Russian Intelligentsia in the Nineteenth Century*, 2005). The second book *Friendship, Family, Revolution: Nikolai Charushin and the Populist Generation of the 1870s*, 2016) was co-authored with Ben Eklof (Indiana University).

Tatiana was a Fulbright visiting scholar at Indiana University (2011), DAAD visiting scholar at Freiburg University (2010), a visiting scholar at Tübingen University (2013) and Munich University (2016). Her current research focuses on the history of photography in the Late Imperial Russia, collective biography, autobiography, and memory.
